The play is filled with fascinating character roles, including the 'Donald O'Connor-type' pianist, Betty, the Virginia belle in the chorus, along with a bevy of chorus girls, gangsters and other assorted characters. The set, mostly on an empty stage, is a snap. The Cohan songs are among his most memorable: 'Give My Regards To Broadway,' 'You're A Grand Old Flag,' 'Mary's A Grand Old Name' and many more. And the cast is flexible with room for an additional chorus of any size, plus optional choreography if desired.
